Onancock School Nature Trail

The Onancock School Nature Trail is a beautiful walk along the Onancock creek with a wide variety of native plants to examine. Due to the terrain of the trail (natural grass/dirt) it was unfortunately found to be a non accessible garden. This garden was originally funded by a Chesapeake Bay License Plate grant, and installed as a collaborative effort by several generous organizations throughout the community. In this garden you will see a riparian buffer of native trees including, but not limited to, the following species of native plants: Red Maple, American Beech, Tuliptree, Blackgum, and Sycamore. If accessibility is not a concern, this is a lovely garden to visit. There are sitting areas along the trail which make for a perfect picnic area or nature watching sight. No Limits would also like to mention that near the beginning and end of this trail

we have hidden two Geocaches (Caches = Native Plants of the Eastern Shore #1 & #2). If Geocache is your thing, please feel free to check them out! (Geocaches are in accessible locations at the beginning and end of the trail!)
